



Korean Demilitarized Zone





Day 1:

Arrival in Seoul: Start your trip in Seoul, the capital city of South Korea. Check into your hotel and take some time to rest.

Orientation and DMZ briefing: Visit the DMZ Information Center in Seoul to attend a briefing session. Here, you'll learn about the history, significance, and rules surrounding the DMZ.

Imjingak Park: Travel to Imjingak Park, located near the border. Explore the park, which is filled with monuments, statues, and exhibits related to the Korean War and the division of the two Koreas.

The Third Tunnel: Visit the Third Tunnel, one of the four known tunnels dug by North Korea to infiltrate South Korea. Descend into the tunnel and learn about its history.



Day 2:

Joint Security Area (JSA): Head to the JSA, the only place along the DMZ where North and South Korean soldiers stand face-to-face. Take a guided tour and witness the blue huts that straddle the border, stepping into North Korean territory.

Panmunjom: Explore Panmunjom, a small village in the JSA where the armistice agreement was signed in 1953. Visit the Freedom House, Conference Row, and the Bridge of No Return.

Dora Observatory: Proceed to the Dora Observatory, an observation deck that provides panoramic views of North Korea. On clear days, you can see the North Korean city of Kaesong and even the flagpole atop the Kijŏng-dong propaganda village.



Day 3:

DMZ Eco-Park: Visit the DMZ Eco-Park, a nature reserve within the DMZ. Explore the preserved ecosystem and learn about the efforts made to protect and restore the environment.

Dorasan Station: Stop by Dorasan Station, the northernmost railway station in South Korea. Though trains do not currently operate to the North, the station symbolizes the hope for reunification and serves as a reminder of the division.

Korean War Museum: Return to Seoul and visit the Korean War Museum. The museum provides in-depth exhibits and artifacts relating to the Korean War and its aftermath.



Day 4:

Optional: Additional Seoul Exploration: If time permits, spend the last day exploring other historical and cultural sites in Seoul, such as Gyeongbokgung Palace, Bukchon Hanok Village, or the National Museum of Korea.
