



Day 1: Arrival in Taipei

- Arrive in Taipei and check into your accommodation.
- Get familiar with the city's transportation system,
 especially the MRT (subway) lines.
- Enjoy a leisurely evening exploring the local area around your accommodation.



<u>Day 2: Introduction to National</u> <u>Palace Museum</u>

- Head to the National Palace Museum early in the morning to beat the crowds.
- Begin your visit with the museum's introduction and overview exhibits to gain context.
- Spend the morning exploring the Jadeite
 Cabbage and Meat-shaped Stone, two of the museum's most famous artifacts.
- Have lunch at the museum's restaurant or a nearby eatery.
- <u>In the afternoon, explore the calligraphy</u>, <u>ceramics, and paintings exhibits.</u>
- <u>Take a break in the museum's picturesque</u> garden.
- <u>Consider attending a guided tour or lecture if available.</u>
- Evening at your leisure to rest or explore Taipei's dining scene.



Day 3: In-Depth Exploration

- Return to the museum to explore specific galleries or themes you're interested in, such as bronze artifacts, ceramics, or ancient manuscripts.
- <u>Participate in any interactive workshops or</u> <u>demonstrations offered by the museum.</u>
- Take a lunch break either within the museum or at a nearby restaurant.
