

ST.PETERSBURG





Day 1:

- Arrive in St. Petersburg and check into your hotel.
- Start your exploration with a visit to the State Hermitage Museum, one of the world's largest and most prestigious art museums. Spend several hours exploring its vast collection, including works by famous artists such as Leonardo da Vinci and Rembrandt.

Day 4:

- Visit the Peter and Paul Cathedral inside the Peter and Paul Fortress to witness the noon cannon firing ceremony.
- Explore the Yusupov Palace, known for its opulent interiors and its association with the assassination of the mystic Rasputin.
- In the evening, enjoy a night out at the lively Dumskaya Street, known for its bars, restaurants, and vibrant nightlife.





Day 5:

- Before departing, visit the St. Isaac's Cathedral, one of the largest Orthodox cathedrals in the world. Climb to the colonnade for panoramic views of the city.
