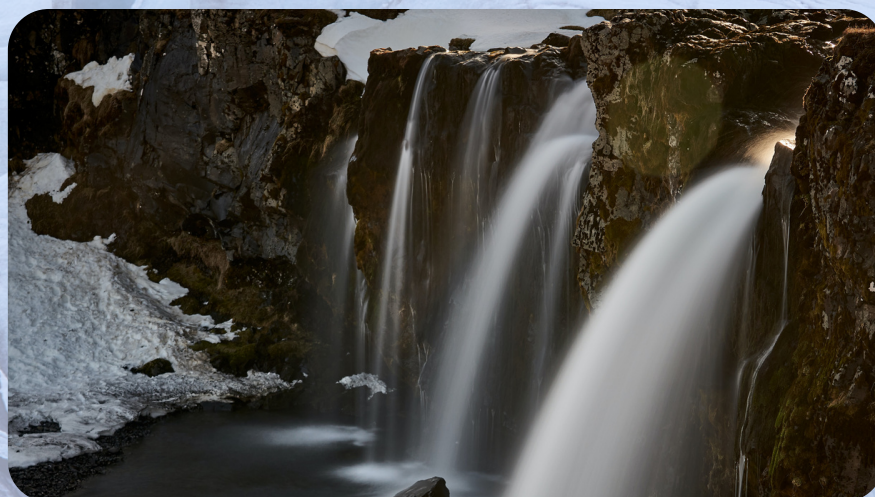
5-NIGHT, 6-DAY ITINERARY FOR EXPLORING THE ICELAND
OFF THE BEATEN PATH

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Day 1: Arrival in Reykjavik

Arrive in Reykjavik, the capital city of Iceland. Spend the day exploring the city and its many attractions, such as the Hallgrímskirkja Church and the Harpa Concert Hall. In the evening, enjoy a meal at a local restaurant. Spend the night in Reykjavik.



Day 2: Snæfellsnes Peninsula

Drive to the Snæfellsnes Peninsula, located on the western coast of Iceland. The peninsula is known for its rugged coastline, volcanic craters, and black sand beaches. You can visit attractions such as the Arnarstapi Cliffs, the Kirkjufell Mountain, and the Djúpalónssandur Beach. Spend the night in the Snæfellsnes area.



Day 3: Vatnajökull National Park
